



A321-232 RESTORATION, MUMBAI, INDIA



The Aircraft had been cannibalized for parts by the operator and remained inactive for 1.5 years. The leasing company requested SOAR to restore the aircraft for ferry flight from India to England to major maintenance.

The complex scope of work , requiring more than 1,300 parts, included flight

deck, avionics bay, air-conditioning system restorations, engine, thrust reverser and APU installations. Landing gear component refit, maintenance manual restoration after storage, A4 Check and testing of all systems.

Its ferry flight to England was accomplished without incident.
